

## Stephen A. Woodbury

Senior Economist

Dr. Woodbury is a labor economist who has published articles on unemployment insurance, reemployment programs, pensions, health insurance, and nonwage compensation. He is currently director of a National Academy of Social Insurance project on “Strengthening Unemployment Insurance for the Twenty-First Century.”

Dr. Woodbury has served on the faculty at Michigan State University since 1982 and has been a professor of economics there since 1994. He has also held faculty appointments at Pennsylvania State University and the University of Stirling, Scotland. During 1993-1994, he served as deputy director of the Advisory Council on Unemployment Compensation. In 1999-2000, he served as president of the Midwest Economics Association.



He received his PhD and MS in economics from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and a B.A. in economics from Middlebury College.
